### ART 2270 - Fine Art Internship

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### Course Description:

Practicum providing student with experience in organizing and hanging art exhibits, assisting in studios or working in arts administration. Seven practicum hours per week.

### Course Outcomes:

#### Documentation Skills

Develop and prepare written documentation of volunteer hours with a synopsis/analysis of volunteer experience.

#### Interact With Greater Art Community

Gain experience working in the greater art community by volunteering at an arts organization or assisting a working professional artist.

**Assessment Method:** Behavioral observations

**Performance Criteria:** 70% Quality or better

#### Personal Point of View

Develop a personal point of view regarding art/art history and increase technical and professional ability and awareness.

**Assessment Method:** Portfolios

**Performance Criteria:** 70% Quality or better

### Outline:

Each student is responsible for finding an arts organization or working professional artist to accept them as a volunteer. The student must spend 30 volunteer hours during the semester working at assigned tasks. Upon completion of these hours, the student will provide documentation of completion of those hours from the organization and a synopsis/analysis of the time in the form of a typed 3-page paper.
