Performance Criteria: Students will investigate assigned local resources as a group and prepare a thorough presentation and written report to class. Content of the presentation must meet 75% of the criteria of the assignment.

Americans with Disabilities Act

Demonstrate knowledge of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and its impact on employment issues.

Assessment Method: Locally developed exams

Performance Criteria: Students will take a pre-test and post-test guestionnaire to determine their level of understand of the American with Disabilities Act (ADA). Students will score 80% or higher on questionaire.

Assessment Method: Behavioral observations

Performance Criteria: Students must score a 80% or better on a rubric filled out by the teacher and their peers.

Assessment Method: External examiner

Performance Criteria: Students must complete 10 hours of Service Learning as per requirements established in the syllabus.
