Course Description:

Students work in the field at an approved automotive service business. The credit that is earned for the internship is applied toward degree requirements. Students prepare and submit reports online and are evaluated by the course instructor as well as their on-site supervisor. Students will practice service procedures on steering and suspension, electrical systems and engines following their second semester. Twenty co-op hours per week.

Online Internship Project

Complete internship paperwork as assigned by the faculty coordinator.

Assessment Method: Portfolios

Performance Criteria: 80% completion of student weekly report outlining work activities accessed online and submitted for instructors review via online access.

Work site performance

Satisfactory performance on the job as indicated by the site supervisor.

Assessment Method: Performance appraisals

Performance Criteria: Student has to score at least "2" out of 4 on an employer administered evaluation

Computer Based Training

Complete assigned self-study computer based training accessed through the corporation's website.

Assessment Method: External examiner

Performance Criteria: 100% completion of Computer Based Training Modules assigned by the faculty coordinator
