#### Patient Assessment

Apply the knowledge and skill obtained throughout the paramedic program in the assessment of patients through written / oral simulated patients.

**Assessment Method:** Locally developed exams

**Performance Criteria:**

On an examination created by the EMS department, 100% of the successful students will score at least a 70% on written examinations covering the patient assessment of the out of hospital patient.

#### Critical Thinking

Apply knowledge and skill obtained throughout the paramedic program in obtaining, deciphering understanding, and applying data related to the care of patients with multiple pathologies.

**Assessment Method:** Locally developed exams

**Performance Criteria:**

On an examination created by the EMS department, 100% of the successful students will score at least a 70% on written examinations covering the critical thinking in the care of the out of hospital patient.
