Course Description:

Basic parameters of music through a survey of styles from Gregorian Chant to jazz and current popular styles focusing on melody, rhythm, harmony, performance media and form.

Listen to music and analyze melodic, rhythmic, harmonic, formal structures and style.

Assessment Method: Performance appraisals

Performance Criteria: Demonstrate understanding by scoring at least 70 percent in all areas of a rubric.

Oral Competence

Compare and contrast musical terms, concepts, important pieces and historical figures in each of the major music history eras.

Assessment Method: Performance appraisals

Performance Criteria: Fluent discussion of musical terms, concepts, important pieces and important historical figures with at least 70% of possible points.
