Course Description:

Provides the theoretical information to facilitate transition to beginning Associate Degree Nurse. Integrates roles and responsibilities of the nurse with principles of care of a group of patients/families. Analyzes concepts of communication, conflict resolution, and health care delivery systems. Emphasizes responsibility, accountability, and professional development. A minimum of ten (10) online class hours and twenty (20) classroom hours per half semester.
