Given a case study, the student will be able to discuss the role of occupation in the promotion of health and the prevention of disease and disability within a specified culture with a minimum of 79% on the performance rubric..

Knowledge of global social issues

Demonstrate knowledge of global social issues and prevailing health and welfare needs.

Assessment Method: Focus groups

Performance Criteria:

Given a case study, the student will be able to discuss global social issues and prevailing health and welfare needs within a specified culture with a minimum of 79% on the performance rubric.

Contexts of health care

Demonstrate the ability to describe the contexts of health care, education, community, and social systems as they relate to the practice of occupational therapy.

Assessment Method: Focus groups

Performance Criteria:

Given a case study, the student will be able to discuss the contexts of health care, education, community, and social models or systems as they relate to the practice of occupational therapy with a minimum of 79% on the performance rubric.

Effects of disability

Understand the effects of heritable diseases, genetic conditions, disability, trauma, and injury to the physical and mental health and occupational performance of the individual.

Assessment Method: Focus groups

Performance Criteria:

Given a case study, the student will be able to discuss the effects of a physical or psychosocial dysfunction on the individual and the family within a specified culture at a minimum of 79% on the performance rubric.
